web river noun riv er ?ri v?r often attributive synonyms of river 1 a a natural stream of water of usually considerable volume b watercourse 2 a something resembling a river a river web 20 hours ago a minnesota woman admitted in a guilty plea wednesday that she left her newborn baby boy to die on the banks of the mississippi river in 2003 fox news matter was arrested on may 10 2022 at web 15 hours ago a fort myers beach man has been arrested for burglarizing a restaurant after he was spotted in the caloosahatchee river naked on january 24th the fort myers police marine unit was dispatched web jan 20 2023 river ultimately from latin ripa bank any natural stream of water that flows in a channel with defined banks modern usage includes rivers that are multichanneled intermittent or ephemeral in flow and channels that are practically bankless the concept of channeled surface flow however remains central to the definition web dec 4 2022 the Nile river is approximately 4 100 miles long and was historically thought to be the longest river in the world there is plenty of debate surrounding this however for many believe the Amazon river in south america might be longer according to the united states geological survey the Nile is about 100 miles longer than the Amazon web 2 hours ago environmental experts warn that the discharge into Hudson river could impact about 100 000 people and seven surrounding municipalities dr helen caldicott president of physicians for social web jun 11 2018 a river forms from water moving from a higher elevation to a lower elevation all due to gravity when rain falls on the land it either seeps into the ground or becomes runoff which flows downhill into rivers and lakes on its journey towards the seas in most landscapes the land is not perfectly flat it slopes downhill in some direction web jun 11 2018 river lengths or river length data are affected not only by some of the natural and artificial causes noted in the preceding paragraph but also by the precision of various techniques of measurement by the scale of available maps or aerial photographs and by somewhat arbitrary decisions web a river is a ribbon like body of water that flows downhill from the force of gravity a river can be wide and deep or shallow enough for a person to wade across a flowing body of water that is smaller than a river is called a stream creek or brook some rivers flow year round while others flow only during certain seasons or when there has been a lot of rain web jan 22 2023 roger gray of rice lake wis biked the length of the mississippi river last summer biking about 75 miles per day for 33 days gray said he was likely the least experienced biker on the trip
